

Do you have a septic tank?

Ever done any maintenance on it???

Like your air conditioner, car, computer and other common appliances and systems, septic tanks also require maintenance. Failing to maintain your system can result in its malfunction and increased risks to the environment, your health and your wallet!

How do I know if I have a septic tank? The simplest way to tell is to check your water bill (see picture at right). If you have a "\$0.00" charge on the "Sewer Amount Charged" line (and the account is not an irrigation account) you probably have a septic tank.

I think I have a septic tank, so what next? See the other side of this flyer for details on how to get more information.

If this line shows a \$0.00 charge you probably have a septic tank.
